Notes: Students in Psychology may also choose Disaster Response specialty. : Students double-majoring in Psychology and Sociology may use PSYC 241/SOC 241 Social Psychology in both majors and may use either statistics course, SOC 309 Social Science Statistics or PSYC 371 Statistics in Psychological Research, and either methods course, SOC 410 Methods of Social Research or PSYC 373 Research Methods in Experimental Psychology (NOT PSYC 275), to fulfill requirements for both majors.

a. If you have completed PSYC 101 prior to your first year it is recommended you take PSYC 233: Applied Psychology during the first semester.

b. If you are planning to apply to graduate school in Psychology, consider taking PSYC 373 instead of PSYC 275. PSYC 373 should be taken after PSYC 371.

c. Take either PSYC 301/L (Fall) or PSYC 302/L (Spring). If a student chooses to take both, one course can be used towards PSYC electives.

d. PSYC Diversity Electives include: PSYC 321, 366, 423, 443, 446, 456, 460 (PSYC 321 may count as a Foundation or Diversity elective, but not both).

e. PSYC Foundation Electives include: PSYC 241, 301/L, 302/L, 321, 406, 411, 461 (see note above regarding PSYC 321).

f. PSYC Electives: Any non-required USD Psychology course (with a PSYC prefix) will count as a PSYC elective, except for PSYC 359.

g. Students in a career track that involves graduate training in Psychology or a related field are advised to take either the College Algebra Pathway or the Calculus Pathway, depending on their chosen field. Please discuss your plans with your PSYC Department Advisor.
